Jeanne Kincaid - Biography



Jeanne M. Kincaid is a 1982 graduate of the University of Oregon School of Law and a shareholder in the Portland, Maine law firm of Bernstein, Shur, Sawyer & Nelson, P.A., and Advanced Educational Solutions, an educational consulting division of the firm.

Ms. Kincaid's legal practice emphasis is representation of schools and universities on issues concerning both students and employees with disabilities. She writes and lectures widely in the area of disability law and education.

For many years she served as a special education hearing officer and mediator for the State of New Hampshire. Ms. Kincaid has served as an adjunct faculty member of the University of New Hampshire's Graduate School of Education, Antioch University and Franklin Pierce Law Center. She previously served as an advisor to AHEAD, a national organization whose membership consists of higher education staff that coordinate services for students with disabilities.

Ms. Kincaid formerly held staff attorney positions with the U.S. Department of Education's Office for Civil Rights, the Oregon Department of Education and served as a hearing officer for the Oregon Bureau of Labor and the New Hampshire Department of Education. Ms. Kincaid has authored book supplements to Section 504, the ADA and the Schools and is a contributing author to the national publication Disability Compliance for Higher Education.
